## Humphreys Gets Beeson Award

Divinity professor Fisher H. Humphreys was named the inaugural recipient of the Beeson Divinity School Teaching Award at Samford. The award, made possible by a gift from a former Beeson student, will be presented annually.

Dr. Humphreys has been a Beeson faculty member since 1990. A specialist in

systematic theology, he is the author of 10 books and numerous journal articles. He has served as pastor of churches in Mississippi, Alabama and Illinois.

"This award recognizes the enduring influence of our wonderful Beeson faculty on the lives and ministries of our students," said Beeson Dean Timothy George. ■

## McWhorter School of Pharmacy Establishes International Online Journal

Samford's McWhorter School of Pharmacy has a new presence on the Internet: *The International Journal of Pharmacy Education*, an Internet-only publication that appeared in April.

The journal, edited by pharmacy professor Robert H. Schrimsher, is a quarterly, peer-reviewed publication with a multi-dimensional focus: international pharmacy, clinical pharmacy, pharmaceutical education, pharmaceutical sciences, drug information, editorials and pharmacy student papers.

"Internet journals have become common during recent years," said Dr. Schrimsher. "Many print journals also have an Internet equivalent, but Internet-only journals have the advantage of being considerably less expensive because they have little or no printing and distribution costs."

The process for submitting and approving manuscripts is relatively the same for both print and Internet journals, he said. Once a manuscript is approved, the major difference is manuscript preparation. For the

Internet journal, instead of galley proof "hard copies," the text and other associated materials (figures, tables, etc.) are converted to Internet-viewable formats.

The editorial board includes members representing most pharmacy disciplines from the United States, Korea, Japan, Wales and the Netherlands. Members are listed on the Web site.

Schrimsher believes the journal will have a broad appeal within pharmacy because it welcomes articles from international sources and students.

"We anticipate that the international appeal will result in articles accenting international curricula, models and developments," he said. "And students will have an avenue for publishing quality, peer-reviewed research papers throughout all schools of pharmacy."

Plans are being formulated to involve all alumni and parents of current and former students in the Samford Club, an umbrella organization that will include the current alumni and parents councils, and a re-energized alumni and parents association. Details about the Samford Club concept will be announced in a few weeks, according to Michael Morgan, vice president for university relations. ■
