Applicants with an associate of arts or an associate of science from an Alabama community college will be able to use their degree to satisfy all general education requirements for the program. Regardless of how many credits were earned during the course of the two-year degree, students will still be required to complete 68 credit hours for the award of their baccalaureate degree from Samford University.

The Bachelor of Arts with a major in Liberal Studies allows students to craft their own course of study from a selection of courses in the fields of behavioral science, legal studies, communications, and leadership studies. This broad, interdisciplinary major is flexible enough to meet the needs of students interested in a variety of disciplines. Challenging them to think critically and communicate more effectively, the B.A. in Liberal Studies will also provide students with real-world knowledge and skills.

The calculations of progress towards graduation on this evaluation must be approved by the Student Records Office and, therefore, are considered unofficial. The student is responsible for monitoring and meeting all requirements for graduation. However, this may be used as a guide to approximate academic progress. Refer to the course descriptions in the university catalog to determine if prerequisites are required for any given course.
