COST: **Program fee:** \$11,626
Tuition: 12 credit hours at \$600 per credit hour.

The Semester Program Fee includes: airfare from Atlanta, airport transfers, accommodation and breakfast for 14 weeks, a daily breakfast and a weekly meal allowance of £80, student health insurance for four months, two group day trips within the U.K., a Paris weekend, a discount pass to cultural and historical sites, eight theatre plays of professor's choice, a cellular phone (student covers cost of calls), and class activities per selection of professor.

A course load of 12 credit hours is allowed. All students must take British Heritage and Culture (4 credits) and must enroll for at least one of the professor-taught courses (4 credits). Students may take both professor taught classes. The remaining credits may be selected from the optional courses listed below.

LOND 360.01x – British Heritage and Culture (4 credits): Team taught by British lecturers and Samford Professor-in-Residence. An interdisciplinary study of British life from the perspectives of history, architecture, literature, economics, political science, religion, art and sociology. This course will satisfy the social science or humanities requirement in general education.(4 credits)

FAMS 399.01x – Professor Francoise Horn: Not-for-Profit Organizations: English Origins, Modern Missions: A study of the history and development of the non-profit sector and a real-time analysis of a modern non-profit organization. (4 credits)

POLS 399.02x – Professor Randolph Horn: The British Invasion: Empire and Immigration in the Nations of Great Britain cross-listed with ENGL/GEOG/HIST/JMC: This course examines the impact of early invaders (e.g. Romans, Saxons, Vikings and Normans) and more recent immigrants from the West Indies, Africa and Asia on regional subcultures and main stream British culture. (4 credits)

OPTIONAL COURSES:

Students may enroll in these courses to reach the required 12 credit hours. Students with a 3.0 GPA plus approval of the London Programs Office and their advisor may take up to 14 credit hours.

LOND 200 – The British Theatre: Lectures by British professor, a backstage theatre tour, and eight nights at the theatre bring British theatre to life. This course satisfies the theatre appreciation requirements. (2 credits)

LOND 201 - Art with a British Accent: Art appreciation that draws on the visual resources of London's National Gallery, Tate Gallery, British Museum and other venues for an enriching experience in the arts. This course is taught by a British professor and may be substituted for the ART 200 general education fine arts requirement. (2 credits)
