THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Samford University's Cumberland School of Law accepts visiting student applications for summer, fall and spring admission.

» Who May Apply

Students currently attending ABA-approved law schools are eligible to apply for visiting student status. Applications from students who have been or are in the process of being academically dismissed from an ABA-approved law school will not be considered. Students attending non-ABA-approved law schools may be granted special permission to take coursework at Cumberland School of Law. This determination is made by the Assistant Dean for Admission and Enrollment Management on a case-by-case basis.

» How Applications Should be Submitted

Applicants must download an application from the Samford University's Cumberland School of Law website. This application is not available through the Law School Admission Council.

» What Completes an Application

A complete application includes, a completed and signed Visiting Student Application, a personal statement that addresses why the applicant desires to take classes at Samford University's Cumberland School of Law, a \$50 application fee, an official letter of good standing from the applicant's ABA-approved law school, and an official letter stating both that the applicant is authorized to take courses at Cumberland School of Law AND that those credit hours will count toward the applicant's law degree.

» When are Decisions Made

Admissions decisions on complete applications are made on a rolling basis. It is common for decisions to be made within two weeks of an application's completion.

» Where Correspondence is Sent

Decision letters are mailed to the permanent mailing address listed on the application. Other correspondence, including updates, reminders and other important information will be emailed throughout the admissions process.



VISITING STUDENT APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

FINANCIAL AID

After submitting an application, those applicants who wish to receive federal aid should update their FAFSA profile to include "Samford University" (federal school code: 001036) among the universities to receive their information. This will expedite the processing of any federal assistance once admitted. Samford University's Office of Financial Aid assists students with finding the appropriate financial aid. The Law School's merit, need-based, leadership and peer scholarships are not available for visiting students.

REGISTRATION AND TUITION

Once admitted, visiting students will be allowed to register for classes. Currently enrolled law students who have pre-registered in a timely manner will receive priority if a course is over-subscribed. After registration, tuition will post to the student's Samford account. The University assigns every admitted student a SUid number that can be used to access financial aid information and E-bills. The SUid and corresponding password will be emailed after an applicant is admitted.

CHARACTER AND FITNESS

In addition to a bar examination, there are character, fitness, and other qualifications for admission to the bar in every U.S. jurisdiction. Applicants are encouraged to determine the requirements for any jurisdiction in which they intend to seek admission by contacting the jurisdiction. Addresses for all relevant agencies are available through the National Conference of Bar Examiners.

A character and fitness review will require truthful, accurate and complete reporting of all requested information related to past conduct that bar examiners may deem relevant to one's fitness to practice law, in most jurisdictions including (but not limited to) all criminal arrests, charges, plea agreements, convictions, or instances of being taken into custody, as a juvenile or adult; all traffic violations except minor parking citations; involvement as a party to civil litigation; acts of fraud, dishonesty or lack of candor; educational discipline or misconduct; failure to pay financial obligations; and substance abuse. Many jurisdictions require disclosure of all criminal arrests, charges, plea agreements or convictions, as a juvenile or adult, even where the record has been expunged.

It should be noted, however, that while bar admission boards require complete disclosure of requested information, in many instances past relevant conduct, particularly if isolated and/or not recent, has not resulted in denial or delay of admission to the bar in a particular jurisdiction of interest. (This is not to suggest or predict how any jurisdiction's bar admissions board would respond to any applicant's particular conduct disclosures going forward.)

A failure to truthfully, accurately and completely respond to a character and fitness inquiry, however, is commonly deemed a character and fitness violation in and of itself, and may be more detrimental to bar admission prospects than the undisclosed or incorrectly disclosed underlying conduct.

You are encouraged to determine the character and fitness requirements of the jurisdiction(s) where you intend to practice law. If you are uncertain where you will practice law, you may wish to review the Standard NCBE Character and Fitness Application, titled Request for Preparation of a Character Report, which is used by a number of jurisdictions' bar admission authorities. Addresses for all relevant agencies are available at ncbex.org.

Applicants must attach separate addenda explaining in detail each instance that necessitates a "yes" response to these questions. It is not sufficient to simply attach court records. You must explain the circumstances that gave rise to each occurrence, any charges received and the outcome of those charges. Those who provide unclear responses will be asked for clarification and/or additional information. Applicants should also be aware that this law school application is a "continuing application." Continuing applications require applicants to update their responses to these questions as needed throughout the application process. Should an event occur, either before or after applicants receive their admission decision, that would change their response to a question in their application, they must immediately communicate the details of that event in writing to the Assistant Dean for Admission and Enrollment Management.
