Unconditional Graduate Admission Requirements:

1. Degree Requirements

- Earned bachelors degree from a regionally accredited college or university, or
- Earned bachelors degree from a non-regionally accredited institution and an earned masters or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution, and a passing score on the prescribed Praxis II subject assessment test if one is prescribed

Prospective students must submit two official transcripts from any college or university attended to:

2. Evaluation of undergraduate transcript by the certification officer to validate an undergraduate GPA of 2.8 on a 4.0 scale in each of the following areas:
- Overall coursework
 - Major courses – all courses in this area must have been passed with a grade of C- or higher.

3. Teaching Field requirements:

Biology

- An academic major in Biology on your official transcript or
- 32 semester hours in Biology including at least 19 semester hours of upper-division credit or
- Passing score on Praxis 0235

English/Language Arts

- An academic major in an area included in English/Language Arts – e.g., English, Speech, Drama/Theatre, and Journalism – and at least one course in each of the other listed areas of English/Language Arts or
- 32 semester hours in an area of English/Language Arts including at least 19 semester hours of upper-division credit. At a minimum, coursework must include courses in Literature, Grammar, Reading skills, Writing, Speech, Theatre, and Print or Broadcast Journalism or
- Passing score on Praxis 0041

General Science

- An academic major in an area included in the sciences – e.g., biology, chemistry, Earth or space science, or physics with at least one course in each of the other listed areas of general science or
- 32 semester hours in an area of the sciences including at least 19 semester hours of upper-division credit and at least one course in each of the following areas: Biology, chemistry, Earth or space science or physics or
- Passing score on Praxis 0435

History

- An academic major in History on your official transcript or
- 32 semester hours in History including at least 19 semester hours of upper-division credit or
- Passing score on Praxis 0941

Math

- An academic major in Math on your official transcript or
- 32 semester hours in Math including at least 19 semester hours of upper-division credit or
- Passing score on Praxis 0061

Social Science

- An academic major in an area included in the social studies – e.g., economics, geography, history, and political science – and at least one course in each of the other listed areas of Social Studies or
- 32 semester hours in an area of Social Studies including at least 19 semester hours of upper-division credit. At a minimum, coursework must include courses in economics, geography, history, and political science or
- Passing score on Praxis 0081

Spanish

- An academic major in Spanish on your official transcript or
- 32 semester hours in Spanish including at least 19 semester hours of upper-division credit or
- Passing score on Praxis 0191

4. Completion of application.
5. Completion of a 3-5 page (double-spaced) paper discussing a current issue in secondary education. Paper must include at least one resource and be in APA style with a reference page.
6. 1 page statement of purpose.
7. Interview with the FYNT Admissions Committee (or members thereof).
8. Three letters of recommendation from professors, employers, colleagues, friends, or clergy addressed to Ashley Cacioppo.
9. Score on *Graduate Record Examination (GRE) of 287 (new 2011 grading scale combined score of verbal and quantitative. or 800 (combined verbal and quantitative on old GRE); this requirement includes a passing score on the writing assessment portion of the GRE with a 3.0 or higher, or score of 396 on the Miller Analogy Test (MAT). See the section on testing information for more details.
10. Suitability letter from the Alabama State Department of Education confirming background clearance by the Alabama Bureau of Investigation (ABI) and Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for a background check.

Summary of Unconditional Graduate Admission Standards:

1. Two official transcripts from any college or university attended.
2. Minimum GPA of 2.8/4.0 on ALL college work attempted and in the MAJOR area.
3. Teaching Field Requirements met (may be completed by passing the Praxis II).
4. Completion of application.
5. Three letters of recommendation.
6. Passing score on the MAT or GRE (including passing score on GRE writing sample).
7. Suitability letter confirming background clearance check.
8. Satisfactory score on 3-5 page paper on a current issue in secondary education.
9. Submission of the Statement of Purpose.

When each student's file is complete, he or she will be presented to the Graduate Admission Committee for review and formal admission. Please note that submission of an application to the Graduate Program does not signify admission to any program. **Upon acceptance to the program, a \$25 fee* will be required to process your application by the Director of Graduate Admissions Office.** This fee is nonrefundable. *Fee is waived for Samford University graduates.

The program accommodates those working part or full-time, including those currently teaching with provisional certificates, and to this end, courses are offered in late afternoon, evening, or Saturdays. Since observation in a variety of classroom settings is a vital component of teacher education, teacher candidates enrolled in the program are required to complete a minimum of 20-65 observation hours per term (this does not apply to content coursework), depending upon the course schedule. Students who work full-time must be willing to use leave or vacation time to complete this assigned classroom setting. It is possible, when teaching with a provisional certificate, to obtain permission to overlap one's regular teaching assignment with the internship experience.

The program is composed of 36 credit hours (depending upon prospective student's transcript) plus any pre-requisite credit hours necessary for admission. Of this total of 36 hours, 24 hours are in professional courses, including the internship, and 12 are in the student's chosen content area or teaching field. If candidates pace themselves to advance with their cohort group, the program can be completed in 16-18 months. All students must complete all parts of the program within five years (3 years if currently teaching under a Special Alternative Certificate).

Samford University does not allow students who are currently in the ABC (Alternative Baccalaureate Certification) Program to enroll in education courses.

Program Completion Requirements:

1. Completion of Coursework

Students in all graduate programs must ensure that they take the correct courses, according to the checklist, and earn the correct number of semester hours for completing the degree. When more than one certification area is earned, all required coursework for both certificates must be taken. The same courses do not count toward two certificates on different levels, e.g., Class A and Class AA.

2. Grade Point Average Requirements

A GPA of 3.0 must be maintained throughout all of the graduate program and until the completion of the program. If your GPA drops below a 3.0, you will be required to withdraw from the program and cannot enter the student teaching experience.

3. Comprehensive Exit Examination

Students must successfully complete a comprehensive exit examination prior to student teaching. This exam will be administered the semester prior to your student teaching.

You must be fingerprinted by the ABI and the FBI before you will be allowed to go into the schools. You must register online prior to arriving at the fingerprint location.

Step 1: Online Registration – www.cogentid.com/AL or www.cogentid.com/alabama

- DO NOT use www.cogentid.com/al
- Applicants are responsible for their own registration. Information incorrectly entered during the registration and submitted during fingerprinting CANNOT be corrected and it is the responsibility of the applicants. Changes to incorrect registration data MAY be corrected online or by telephone prior to fingerprint submission.
- Register for the state of Alabama
- Make sure you select "Admission to a Teacher Education Program/Internship".

Step 2: Payment – Fingerprint fee is \$54.15

- Applicants may pay online during registration using a debit or credit card.
- No cash, credit card, or business checks are accepted at the fingerprint location.
- Applicants may pay at the fingerprint site with a money order or cashier's check. Payments must be made out to Cogent Systems

Step 4: Primary Documentation

- Cogent Services requires current, valid and unexpired picture identification documents. As a primary form of picture ID, a state-issued driver's license may be presented by an applicant while being fingerprinted

Step 5: Proof of Fingerprinting

- You will receive a **letter of suitability** from the Alabama State Department of Education in the mail. I **MUST** have a copy of this documentation for your file folder before you are allowed to begin clinicals.

Master of Science in Education
Alternative A Fifth Year Certification Program in Secondary Education
 Summer or Fall enrollment

The Master of Science in Education Alternative A Fifth Year Certification Program in Secondary Education is designed for graduates of an accredited university who already have a BA or BS degree with a certifiable major in a core teaching field and desire to earn a Class A teaching certificate to teach in their content area at the secondary level of education (grades 6-12). The program accommodates those working part or full-time, including those currently teaching with provisional certificates, and to this end, courses are offered in the late afternoon, evening, or Saturdays (science options only). Since observation in a variety of classroom settings is a vital component of teacher education, teacher candidates enrolled in the program are required to complete a minimum of 10-65 observation hours per term, depending upon their course schedule. Students who work full-time must be willing to use leave or vacation time to complete this requirement. At the end of the program, the internship semester requires a full-day commitment to an assigned classroom setting. It is possible, when teaching with a provisional certificate, to obtain permission to overlap one's regular teaching assignment with the internship experience.

The program is composed of 36 credit hours. Of this total of 36 hours, 24 hours are in professional courses, including the internship, and 12 are in the student's chosen content area or teaching field. If candidates pace themselves to advance with their cohort group, the program can be completed in 18 months. All students must complete all parts of the program within five years.
