

Graduation Rate (Measure 5)

Samford University tracks all teacher candidates from the time of admission until degree completion. The graduation rates represent candidates earning their initial teacher certification from the Alabama State Department of Education. Admission to teacher education is a process normally completed during sophomore year for baccalaureate candidates. All candidates admitted must have, but are not limited to, a sufficient GPA, a satisfactory background check, and passing scores on all Praxis exam requirements as appropriate. The graduation rates provided here signify which of those admitted candidates finish their degree in Fall of 2018 or Spring 2019.
