Position: Adjunct clinical professor, Cumberland Veterans Legal Assistance Clinic

Short description:

Samford University's Cumberland School of Law seeks applicants interested in serving in a Christian university environment for the position of adjunct clinical professor for the Cumberland Veterans Legal Assistance Clinic (C-Vets) beginning in January 2023 and ending in May 2023. The adjunct clinical professor will manage and co-teach our C-Vets clinic seminar that serves veterans in the local community, including supervising students over a docket with a mix of cases including civil law, family law, and criminal law.

The candidate must have a J.D. degree, some experience in administrative, civil, or criminal legal matters, and be able to provide a quality clinical experience. Having a current license to the Alabama Bar is particularly desirable.

The ideal candidate will thus demonstrate the ability and motivation to mentor students.
