Samford University's Howard College of Arts and Sciences invites applications from individuals interested in serving in a Christian university environment to apply for the position of Adjunct Instructor of Spanish. This part-time position will begin in August 2025.

Candidates should have an M.A in the area of Spanish Language or a related field from an institutionally accredited university (or equivalent). Highly qualified candidates with exceptional professional experience within the discipline may also be considered without having an M.A. The candidate will be expected to teach 100 and 200 level of Spanish courses as part of the Bachelor of Arts (B.A) in, and other Howard College core courses, which may include cross- disciplinary collaboration.

Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled.

Applicants should submit the following:

- A letter of application outlining the qualifications for the position
- A brief statement of teaching philosophy
- A current CV/resume
