- Initial Canvas training was a great success with
 14 training sessions and 238 registrations!
 Wow! Thank you to all the pioneers who participated in this training. We hope to have
 Canvas back in the fall for another series of training. Stay tuned.
- Courses for summer and fall are currently available in Moodle and Canvas. As a reminder, Canvas pilot groups will begin this
 summer. Course priority for participation in the pilot program include courses in online programs with new student cohorts. This prioritization will ensure sufficient support is available throughout the course development
- Other courses will be considered on a case by case basis (factors include Samford Approved Online Courses, faculty previously trained in Quality Matters / Canvas, and student need). All faculty are encouraged to utilize Canvas for fall courses. You may access Canvas by clicking here or by visiting samford.instructure.com.
 - Course blueprints for Canvas are now complete. The online blueprint mirrors the Quality Matters shell utilized in Moodle for "W80" courses. Face to face courses will have a "continuity of instruction" blueprint.

DID YOU KNOW?

Creating video content in Kaltura enables instructors to order captions with the click of a button for free! Instructors are encouraged to utilize Kaltura with captions for microlectures and lengthy blocks of content to show a commitment to accessibility. For video feedback on grades and discussion boards, Canvas offers a recording option in the rich text editor (the word processor-like interface).

Next Steps

Instructors teaching a summer course should be working with Instructional Designers by now. The first three modules of each course will be reviewed beginning three weeks prior to the start of the course.

Samford Approved Checklist

To meet Samford Approved Standard 8:

- 1. Use Samford's LMS (Moodle or Canvas)
- 2. Use the QM syllabus template
- 3. Check all PDFs and Word documents for accessibility
- 4. Provide a transcript or enable captions on all instructional videos

EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY TO ENHANCE YOUR ONLINE CLASSROOM

Both Moodle and Canvas allow for the inclusion of multimedia content, most commonly audio and video microlectures in online courses. While it is possible to simply upload or embed a media file directly into a course page, both platforms offer specialized media tools that allow for advanced features.

The Arc media library in Canvas allows users to upload pre-existing content in a variety of formats. Once uploaded, users can request machine-generated closed captions, which average around 85% accuracy. A builtin caption editor allows for fine-tuning and correction of captioning errors. Arc is a relatively new product, and is under continual development by Canvas. It is possible that Samford will discontinue use of the Kaltura media system when and if Arc achieves parity of features.

Until then, Kaltura provides the same functions in both Canvas and Moodle including a new caption editing feature, as well as advanced content creation tools such as narrated PowerPoint presentations and multistream "picture in picture" videos. Kaltura media that has been added within Moodle is simultaneously available in Canvas, as both platforms use the same media library.
