Like most programs, our Doctor of Physical Therapy is a three-year program. We include a heavy emphasis on the sciences so that you have the foundational knowledge you need to make evidence-based clinical decisions for your patients and their families. You will work in a variety of clinical settings to ensure that you have the broadest experience possible to help you find your ultimate calling.

As you earn your D.P.T., you'll work in a variety of settings, from acute care to both in-patient and out-patient clinics. Throughout your rotations, you'll study under the direct supervision of experienced, licensed physical therapists who are both skilled practitioners and committed to your education.
