# **Criminal Law General Course Guide**

Criminal law refers to the body of law that is applied to individuals and/or entities who are accused of committing a crime or are otherwise involved in the criminal justice system. Criminal lawyers include private criminal defense attorneys and public defenders as well as state, local, and federal prosecutors. Defense attorneys defend individuals and entities charged with crimes. Prosecutors work with law enforcement officials to investigate, charge, and as needed try cases on behalf of the state. Criminal lawyers handle a diverse spectrum of criminal cases, including domestic violence, human trafficking, drug crimes, civil rights violations, and white-collar crimes.

In addition to required courses (*e.g.*, Criminal Law, Constitutional Law, Criminal Procedure I, and Evidence), students interested in criminal law should take elective substantive and skills courses addressing criminal law and procedure as well as courses relating to relevant areas of substantive law.<sup>1</sup>
