Labor and Employment Law General Course Guide

Labor and employment law refers to the laws that govern the rights and duties between employers and workers. This area of law includes "wage and hour" violations, discrimination, collective bargaining rights, and non-competition disputes. In addition to required courses, students interested in this area should take elective courses relevant to labor and employment law.
