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Online Nursing Programs Ranked By *U.S. News & World Report*

Ida V. Moffett School of Nursing graduate programs earned a #35 national ranking for online education in new rankings released Jan. 15 by *U.S. News & World Report*. The school was in the top half of all the accredited nursing schools included in this year's overall rankings.

Samford was the highest ranked program among both Southern Conference peers and historically Baptist institutions.

The rankings were based on four criteria: faculty credentials and training, student services and technology, student engagement, and admission selectivity. Samford had especially high scores in faculty credentials and student engagement, according to the *U.S. News* rankings.

"Dr. Jane Martin and the graduate faculty are to be commended for their outstanding work related to the creation and implementation of a quality online graduate nursing education program," said Nena F. Sanders, Ida V. Moffett Nursing School dean. "The students and alumni of our graduate programs

consistently rate the graduate faculty as committed and dedicated to creating a learning environment that is strongly related to student engagement and the achievement of student outcomes. This recognition affirms that we are committed to providing exceptional online programs at the graduate level."

Enrollment in Samford's graduate nursing programs has increased significantly in the last decade, including more than 20 percent in the last five years, Sanders noted, with the availability of online courses and expansion of graduate programs as two of the factors in that growth.

The recognition comes at a time that Samford is placing more emphasis on distance learning, according to David Hakanson, Samford's chief information officer. He is leading a current university-wide study on distance learning.

"This ranking demonstrates Samford's commitment to improving academic services to providing high quality degree programs, with a growing focus on online delivery, to reach students across the country," Hakanson said, "and



the nursing school is serving as a model for the rest of the university in how we can do so successfully."

According to *U.S. News*, a distance learning program is "a program for which all the required coursework for program completion is able to be completed via distance education courses that incorporate Internet-based learning technologies. Distance education courses are courses that deliver instruction to students who are separated from the instructor and support regular and substantive interaction between the students and the instructor synchronously or asynchronously."

London

Students enrolled in the Nursing in the British Isles course, travelled to London Dec. 27-Jan. 10. The course is an observation of the development of medicine with an emphasis on the history of nursing. It also addresses the differences in the current health care systems in the U.S. and the U.K.

While abroad, students visited the Old Operating Room and Theater, a Public Health Walk, the Florence Nightingale Museum, St. Thomas Hospital, Hunterian and Science Museums, and the Royal Hospital Chelsea: Home of the Chelsea Pensioner. They also visited many

Dr. Cahoon Appointed Chair of Nurse Anesthesia Program

Terri M. Cahoon, DNP, CRNA, has been named Chair of the Nurse Anesthesia Program. Cahoon has served as an assistant professor and Associate Chair of the program since its inception in 2003. During her tenure, she has been instrumental in the integration of simulation into the curriculum and she has served as a critical link between the nurse anesthesia program and its alumni.

“The school is very fortunate to

have a person of such integrity, skill and devotion to the profession assume this role,” said Dr. Nena F. Sanders, Dean of the Ida V. Moffett School of Nursing. More than 170 students from 19 states have graduated from the program over the last decade.

Dr. Cahoon is looking forward to this role. “I am excited about the opportunity to continue to work with our incredible faculty, staff, and administration to help students pursue excellence and

promote the outstanding reputation that our graduates have established,” said Cahoon.

Dr. Cahoon’s academic areas of interest include pharmacology, non-technical skills, cardiovascular, and pediatric anesthesia. She practices clinically at St. Vincent’s Hospital or Children’s South one day each week. Prior to joining the faculty, she practiced as a CRNA for nine years and as a registered nurse in CVICU for eight years.

The partnership includes Joy House Ministries in Gressier, Haiti, Dawson Memorial Baptist Church in Homewood, Ala. And Rock Creek Church of Christ in Warrior, Ala.

Nursing Faculty Visit Haiti as Part of Ongoing Partnership

Dr. Cyndi Cortes and **Dr. Debra Whisenant** travelled to the “West” province of Haiti to conduct a health education needs assessment. They are partnering with Joy House Ministries in Gressier, Haiti, Dawson Memorial Baptist Church in Homewood, Ala., and Rock Creek Church of Christ in Warrior, Ala. to train preventive health care workers

using a congregational health model.

Drs. Cortes and Whisenant will visit the area again March 16-23 to conduct six days of clinics seeing “medical” patients, dental patients and providing vision screening. In the afternoons, they will train the congregation based community health workers. Additional training will be

provided quarterly.

Samford Goes Red for Women’s Heart Health

Samford University is recognizing the American Heart Association's *Go Red for Women* movement throughout the month of February, with activities coordinated by the Ida V. Moffett School of Nursing. The movement seeks to promote awareness about the effects of heart disease, especially among women, and raise funds for research and treatment of heart disease.

"Heart disease is the number one cause of death among women," said Nena F. Sanders, Ida V. Moffett School of Nursing dean. "One out of three women will die

from some form of heart disease." The month-long series of events kicked off on Feb. 1 with National Wear Red Day. The school of nursing partnered with St. Vincent's Health Systems to provide free on-campus blood pressure and heart screenings in the cafeteria. The School of Nursing also plans to hold another blood pressure screening in the library in February, Sanders said.

Throughout the month of February, several other Samford departments and organizations will recognize the Go Red

movement. Samford Athletics will sponsor a "red-out" basketball game Feb. 23, and the University Library is hosting a display about heart disease and women's heart health.

"More women die from heart disease than from all cancers combined," Sanders said. "This is a month long effort to bring awareness to everyone about heart disease, especially women."
