3:30 - 4 P.M. CARILLON CONCERT, BEN BROWN PLAZA

Enjoy a carillon concert, played by Stephen Brooks Knight, Samford's carillonneur-in-residence, on the Rushton Memorial Carillon, housed in the Davis Library Belltower. The 60-bell carillon was the first completely chromatic, five-octave carillon in the US when it was installed in 1968. The bells were cast in Holland and each feature an inscription from poems about bells, verses from the Psalms, and Latin phrases that appear on bells cast in Europe in the 15th and 16th centuries. Knight, the Samford carillonneur since 1974, performs regularly. He holds a bachelor's degree in music from the University of Alabama and a master's in music from the University of Michigan. He studied at the Diploma de la Schola Cantorum in Paris, France, and holds a Final Diploma with Great Distinction from the Royal Carillon School in Belgium, where he won a first prize for his composition, *Pasacaglia Grave*. He is the first blind American to win the prize.
