STATEMENT OF EDUCATIONAL NEED

- Currently 34 million people in the United States have diabetes mellitus (DM) with roughly 90-95% of those individuals suffering from Type 2 DM. About 1/3 (88 million) of Americans have prediabetes. In Alabama, approximately 550,000 adults suffer from DM (14.6% of total population) with about 1.3 million adults suffering from prediabetes (34% of total population). In 2012 alone, Alabama had the 3rd highest prevalence of DM in the United States with 1349 individuals dying of the disease. It is critical that pharmacists understand the latest pharmacological treatments for DM as they are the health practitioners most likely to interact with patients on a routine basis. The purpose of this program is to give pharmacists a comprehensive review of the management of Type 2 DM.
