FINDING ART // FOR SEEING

LIVING WORSHIP // FOR DOING

Discuss these passages within your service or in small groups.

- ◆ What does John 2:13-22 say about us as humans?
- ◆ Do we continue to do the things today that made Christ angry in this passage?
- ◆ Why do many people feel the Ten Commandments are relevant to this day and age?
- ◆ How can we continue to follow those laws to glorify God?
- ◆ How can we put aside our own wisdom and trust the wisdom of God?
- ◆ How can we rejoice and praise God in a time of lament and sorrow?

MAKING SPACE // FOR WORSHIPING

Continue keeping the worship space as minimal as possible with decorations and flowers as we are going through a season of suffering and preparation for the resurrected Christ at Easter. Along with this, continue to refrain from singing or saying the word “alleluia”. As stated above, this is a time of suffering and preparation, not a time of praise yet. Using the color purple during lent represents death and suffering, but also royalty.

WRITING POETRY // FOR PRAYING

Here is a thematic prayer that can be used in this service:

God of wilderness and water,
 your Son was baptized and tempted as we are.
 Guide us through this season,
 that we may not avoid struggle,
 but open ourselves to blessing,
 through the cleansing depths of repentance

and the heaven-rending words of the Spirit. Amen.

Here is an intercessory prayer that can be used in this service:

Faithful God of love,
you blessed us with your servant Son
so that we might know how to serve your people
with justice and mercy.
We gather the needs of ourselves and others,
and offer them to you in faith and love,
seeking to be strengthened to meet them.
Shape us and transform us by your grace,
that we may grow in wisdom and in confidence,
never faltering until we have done all that you desire
to bring your realm of shalom to fulfillment. Amen.

Here is a scripture-based prayer that can be used in this service:

Holy One, creator of the stars and seas,
your steadfast love is shown to every living thing:
your word calls forth countless words and souls;
your law revives and refreshes.
Forgive our misuse of our gifts,
that we may be transformed by your wisdom
to manifest for others
the mercy of our crucified and risen Lord. Amen.
