CREATING DRAMA // FOR HEARING

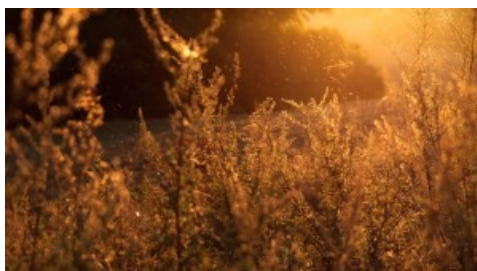
Tell the story of the Good Samaritan, from where we draw our scripture in *lectio divina*, in a new way. Consider using Eugene Peterson's translation from *The Message*.

"That you love the Lord your God with all your passion and prayer and muscle and intelligence—and that you love your neighbor as well as you do yourself." -Luke 10:27, The Message

FINDING ART // FOR SEEING

We suggest you project these pictures or use them in other materials for worshipers to reflect on. You might even consider inviting worshipers to bring or take their own pictures of the sunset.



LIVING WORSHIP // FOR DOING

To reflect on tonight's scripture passage, we suggest using *lectio divina*, an ancient Christian practice that invites us to hear the scripture passage multiple times for the purpose of reflection.

As you prepare to hear the scripture passage, get into a comfortable position, close your eyes, and listen to the whole passage as a unit. I'll leave a few moments of silence after each reading. On the second reading, begin to listen for a word or group of words that shimmer or draw you in. On the third reading, allow yourself to focus on a word or group of words, then begin to think about what God might be wanting to say to you through those group of words.

A reading from Luke 10:25-28.

Close your eyes and listen to the passage and take in the passage as a whole unit. Begin to listen for a phrase or particular part of the passage that stands out to you.

"A legal expert stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to gain eternal life?" Jesus replied, "What is written in the Law? How do you interpret it?" He responded, "You must love the Lord your God with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus said to him, "You have answered correctly. Do this and you will live."

Provide a few moments of silence, then say:

A reading from Luke 10:25-28.

Begin to listen for a word or group of words that shimmer or draw you in.

"A legal expert stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to gain eternal life?" Jesus replied, "What is written in the Law? How do you interpret it?" He responded, "You must love the Lord your God with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus said to him, "You have answered correctly. Do this and you will live."

Provide a few moments of silence, then say:

A reading from Luke 10:25-28.

In this reading, allow yourself to focus on the word or words that stood out to you. After the reading, there will be an extended period of silence. In that silence, focus on those words that stood out to you, and consider what God might be saying to you through this scripture passage.

"A legal expert stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to gain eternal life?" Jesus replied, "What is written in the Law? How do you interpret it?" He responded, "You must love the Lord your God with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus said to him, "You have answered correctly. Do this and you will live."

An extended period of silence follows.

MAKING SPACE // FOR WORSHIPPING

We suggest setting the tone for the service by bringing the dim lighting of evening and sunset in your worship space. This can be done by dimming the lights and place candles throughout the room.

WRITING POETRY// FOR PRAYING

Saint Francis of Assisi was an Italian Catholic friar and preacher who lived in the 12th and 13th centuries. He wrote several prayers which are commonly printed and used to this day. In his passion for caring for our neighbors, especially the poor, St. Francis wrote the following prayer.

*Lord, make me an instrument of thy peace;
Where there is hatred, let me sow love;
Where there is injury, pardon;
Where there is error, the truth;
Where there is doubt, the faith;
Where there is despair, hope;
Where there is darkness, light;
And where there is sadness, joy.*

*O Divine Master,
Grant that I may not so much seek
To be consoled, as to console;
To be understood, as to understand;
To be loved as to love.*

*For it is in giving that we receive;
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;
And it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.*
