LIVING WORSHIP // FOR DOING

Read each scripture passage and discuss what each passage says about God, about Man, and how can it be applied to your life.

Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16

- Talk about the prophecy that Abraham was told about

Psalms 22:23-31

- Talk about discipleship and outreach
- Discuss the praising through suffering that is mentioned

Romans 4:13-25

- Talk about the promise granted through faith

Mark 8:31-38

- What does this passage say about prophecy and discipleship?
- What does this passage say about evil?

MAKING SPACE // FOR WORSHIPING

Continue keeping the worship space as minimal as possible with decorations and flowers as we are going through a season of suffering and preparation for the resurrected Christ at Easter.

Along with this, continue to refrain from singing or saying the word “alleluia”. As stated above, this is a time of suffering and preparation, not a time of praise yet.

WRITING POETRY // FOR PRAYING

Here is a thematic prayer that can be used in this service:

God of the covenant
 in the glory of the cross
 your Son embraced the power of death
 and broke its hold over your people.
 In this time of repentance,
 draw all people to yourself,
 that we who confess Jesus as Lord
 may put aside the deeds of death
 and accept the life of your kingdom. Amen.

Here is an intercessory prayer that can be used in this service:

God of the covenant,
 you call us to be fruitful servants within creation,
 and to offer our lives
 as the foundation of your realm.
 We lay before you the desires of our hearts,
 that we may be transformed by their fulfillment.

Here is a scripture-based prayer that can be used in this service:

God of Sarah and Abraham,
 long ago you embrace your people in covenant
 and promised them your blessing.
 Strengthen us in faith,
 that, with you disciples of every age,
 we may proclaim your deliverance in Jesus Christ
 to generations yet unborn. Amen.
