- Pay attention to the lyrics of the song.

- Pay attention to the music.
 - Does it have complicated melodies and rhythms the average person can't sing?
 - 😵 Is it too high or too low? [Most congregations sing well between thirteen notes: A and E]
 - Is it catchy and simple enough for people to sing?
 - Can you and your team learn and play the song?
- Pay attention to what the song does in worship.
 - Is the song being sung to God or to one another?
 - Is it a song that thanks God?
 - Is it a song that tells God, "We're sorry?"
 - Is it a song about living in community with other Christians?
 - Knowing what the song does will help you place it in worship, and it will help you introduce it to the congregation.

There's a lot of bad worship music out there, but there's a lot of good music, too. The next time you have to choose music for worship, take your time and be thoughtful. You have the great responsibility and privilege of leading your congregation in singing, so ask God to help you make wise decisions. And, don't settle for anything less than the very best you can find.
